Lenbrook first earned its CARF accreditation in 1992 and has successfully re-earned accreditation ever since. Lenbrook was also the first to become CARF accredited in Georgia and remains the only accredited Life Plan Community in Atlanta today.

Nationally, about 250 of the nation's nearly 2,000 Life Plan Communities have earned CARF accreditation. Lenbrook is proud to be among this select group.
